R2R was founded 20 years ago and is funded completely by grants and the incredible generosity of our local community. In March 2022, thanks to the generous donations from people, churches and local businesses, alongside tireless fund-raising, we were able to buy the Genesis Centre, giving a permanent address and fabulous space allowing us to offer homeless and rough sleepers hot meals throughout the week, showering facilities, washing machines and access to Support Services.

In November, due to period of severe cold weather The Genesis Centre was used as somewhere safe and warm that rough sleepers were able to stay overnight.

This was a significant landmark for the Centre and one we always hoped to achieve.

Over 4 nights, working in collaboration with BCP Council and St Mungo's, twelve men and women were able to bed down for the night whilst receiving teas, coffees, and breakfast from our great bunch of volunteers.

The Genesis Centre proved an effective site with all attendees being in great spirits and delighted to be somewhere warm and welcoming during the harshest of nights.



SWEP (Severe Weather Emergency Protocol) is a local authority's temporary response to the risks from severe weather. The protocol is accessible to anyone who needs help, this includes people who do not have need for homeless help.

Christmas 2023 R2R was once again able to host a wonderful Christmas lunch for those in Poole who are in need.

A group of our wonderful volunteers all pulled together to prepare, cook and serve a roast dinner with all the trimmings as well some handmade desserts. On the day over thirty-five lunches were served, and everyone received wrapped gifts. Those using the Genesis Centre on **Boxing Day**, also received a traditional 'cold meats with bubble and squeak' meal. At what is a particularly difficult time of year for so many, the generosity of our volunteers giving their time, allowed us to hopefully spread a small amount of joy at Christmas.
