Christian action on homelessness

Coming out of Covid lock downs in January 2022 the daily offer had become one-hour lunch sessions. Two years on, we are now providing daily drop-ins, twice weekly breakfasts, additional support and social groups as well as access to showers and washing machines.

Recently we have been delighted to be able to offer overnight accommodation during the coldest of weathers when SWEP (Severe Weather Emergency Protocol) is activated.

We continue to receive incredible support from local churches. Both Lytchett Minster Parish Church & St Dunstan's Upton, and St Mary's Catholic Church, provide and serve homemade lunches one Sunday a month each. The Service Users greatly appreciate having a Sunday Meal.

We hope to engage with more churches over the next 12 months who may be keen to provide a monthly Sunday lunch.

SWEP (*Severe Weather Emergency Protocol*) In January there were two separate periods of SWEP activated and during this time we were able to utilise the Genesis Centre to host 12 beds allowing individuals to come in and sleep somewhere safe and warm. This period is a great opportunity to work collaboratively with BCP Council and St Mungo's to ensure everybody is assessed and potential housing solutions are explored.



The continued generosity both financially, through practical donations, and peoples time really has contributed to two wonderful years and whilst the demand unfortunately continues to grow, we have been able to provide a positive, warm and essential environment for those that need it. A big thank you to all who have contributed. On the 20th of March we were once again joined by the wonderful staff of **Baggette & Co Wealth Management** who "took over our "Drop-In. As always, they brought bundles of energy, enthusiasm and whole lot of cooking skills, ensuring those that needed it received a warm welcome and a hot meal.

The ability to keep your feet dry is essential in maintaining good foot care. This can be an incredibly challenging task for someone who is sleeping outside who has trainers or unsuitable footwear.

Late in February we were able to provide those who access our service with an extra special lunch.
